Overview

In the process of developing the Charlotte-Mecklenburg College and Career Readiness ecosystem, the team identified nearly 300 programs appropriate for inclusion. As demonstrated in Figure 2 of the main report, many of these organizations provide services across two or all three of the service categories of Education Support/Post-Secondary Preparation, Postsecondary Offerings, and Career Readiness. In order to increase the usability of the reporting, this directory describes and categories each organization and program as well as presents the services offers and populations served. The organizations are presented in alphabetical order.

Above and Beyond Students provides K-8 students with afterschool and tutoring services to help them succeed in school. ACE Mentor Program of Charlotte • •

ACE Mentor Program of Charlotte provides afterschool and summer opportunities for high school students interested in careers in architecture, construction, and/or engineering. During the school year, the program serves approximately 150 students at six CMS high schools (West Charlotte, South Mecklenburg, East Mecklenburg, Hopewell, Myers Park and Ardrey Kell). Students gain hands-on experience through various activities and field trips, including team-based projects that simulate real-life situations under the mentorship of local industry professionals. In the summer, ACE offers internships through its partnership with the Mayor's Youth Employment Program.

Anthony Foxx Scholars Program •

The Anthony Foxx Scholars Program is a partnership between Central Piedmont Community College (CPCC) and West Charlotte High School designed to help African American males overcome financial obstacles and receive the assistance needed to earn their degree. Every African American male who graduates from West Charlotte High School and enrolls at Central Piedmont Community College will receive a \$2,000 scholarship. The Anthony Foxx Scholars Program was established and funded by a grant from the C.D. Spangler Foundation of Charlotte, N.C.

In an effort to assist African American or minority male students with their transition to college, CPCC will provide the following support services:

- West Charlotte Enrollment Specialist: A representative visits West Charlotte High School weekly to provide students with information on CPCC.
- Early Advising/Registration Program: CPCC offers early advising and registration to allow students to register for summer and fall classes while still in high school.
- Financial Aid Workshops: CPCC invites students and parents to participate in financial aid workshops to learn about the many financial resources available.
- Parent Communication: CPCC offers workshops for parents on how to assist students with their transition to college.
- College Visitation Day: CPCC provides visitation days for the scholars to tour the campus and learn more about CPCC.
- Summer Bridge Program: Students have the opportunity participate in a summer program consisting of academic classes and structured activities.
- MAN UP Male Mentoring Program: Provides comprehensive activities that promote personal development, academic improvement, and social and educational advancement.

Apprenticeship 2000

Apprenticeship 2000 offers technical and industrial apprenticeships for high school juniors and seniors and employment opportunities after graduation. Apprenticeship 2000 partners with various companies that train apprentices for trades such as CNC Machinist, Tool & Die Maker, Mechatronics, and Injection Molding Technician. The 8000 hour training program lasts four years; by the end of the program, apprentices earn an AAS degree in Mechatronics Engineering Technology from Central Piedmont Community College, a Journeyman's Card and Certificate by the State of North Carolina, and a Certificate from the US Department of Labor.

Augustine Literacy Program •

The Augustine Literacy Project pairs volunteer tutors with elementary-school children who struggle with literacy to improve their reading, spelling, and writing skills. Tutors typically meet with their students at their school two to three times per week for the whole school year. The two eligibility requirements for Augustine tutoring are low-income (qualifying for free or reduced price lunch) and below grade-level performance in reading, writing, or spelling. The program primarily works with first-through third-graders at Title I CMS schools.

"Behailu Academy is an arts-based youth development program empowering teens through the arts, academic support, and community service." Behailu Academy seeks to empower youth through activities that "foster creativity, critical thinking, and social responsibility", as well as "prepare youth to be active, responsible, and self-sufficient citizens after high school graduation".

Behailu Academy's Out of School Time Program

Behailu Academy's Out of School Time Program offers daily programming for 7th-12th grade students in Northeast Charlotte, with transportation provided for students at Garinger, Cochrane, and Eastway Middle Schools. The Out of School provide provides access to the arts, enrichment, and resources, and fosters an atmosphere of support and respect among peers and adults.

Exploring Program

- 1) Get involved, learn about a career, and decide to pursue it; or
- 2) Learn enough about the career to determine it's not the right fit for them.

The Opportunity Scholarship Program

The Opportunity Scholarship Program at CPCC was established in 2017 to assist low-income high school graduates from Garinger, Harding, West Mecklenburg, West Charlotte, Vance, and other CMS high schools in obtaining two-year degrees that can lead to meaningful employment and further education. The scholarships cover the full cost of tuition, books, and fees for a two-year period. Students also receive notebook computers and participate in CPCC's Summer Bridge academic enrichment program prior to their first fall semester. Additionally, Opportunity Scholars receive ongoing support and guidance from academic and career coaches who assist with course and career path selection.

Passport Program

The Passport Program is a distinctive transfer program for academically qualified freshman. Admission to the program is by invitation only. Qualified applicants are selected by UNC Charlotte for this competitive program based on their academic background including performance in high school coursework and competitive scores on either the SAT or ACT standardized tests.

These students begin their college career at Central Piedmont Community College where they receive targeted academic advising, student support services, and student life opportunities on both campuses to ensure a seamless and successful transition to UNC Charlotte. In the first year, students complete a minimum of 24 transferable credit hours at CPCC. Advisors at both CPCC and UNC Charlotte work with the Passport students to choose coursework at CPCC that will allow them to make progress toward their specific major at UNC Charlotte. Students who have completed the 24 transferable credit hours with a minimum 2.0 GPA are admitted to UNC Charlotte in their second year to complete their studies. On average, Passport students earn a higher transfer GPA than other transfer students.

Pathways to Careers offers qualified students the unique opportunity to work toward completion of their high school equivalency diploma while receiving occupational and work readiness training. Students who already possess a high school diploma may also be eligible to enroll in Pathways if scholarship funding is available. To ensure student success, the program provides a variety of student support services, academic advising, and training to help students transition to higher level certificates and degree programs or employment. More than 20 short-term training programs are available. Tuition assistance is available for eligible students.

NCWorks NextGen serves youth who demonstrate a potential barrier to employment (e.g., offender, pregnant or parenting, homeless, or foster care youth) through one-on-one, comprehensive support. Career and Technical Education (CTE)

The mission of Charlotte-Mecklenburg Career and Technical Education is to "engage middle and high school students in rigorous and relevant learning in preparation for post-secondary education and careers." CTE classes are offered in many different fields including construction, welding, firefighting, cooking, environmental science, anatomy and physiology, nursing, computer software, graphic arts, mechanical engineering, architectural drafting, business, and marketing. These classes integrate academics with technical skill development to help prepare students for higher-level courses in college or prepare them for the workforce.

CTE courses are now being organized into Career Pathways, which are designed to be a progressive succession of four CMS courses followed by courses at CPCC. The current career pathways are the following: advanced manufacturing, engineering, architecture & 3d prototyping, graphic & digital design, game art design, automotive, culinary & hospitality, carpentry, cosmetology, apparel/fashion design, business management, and marketing. This strategy has just begun.

Academic Internship Program: a work-based instructional strategy designed to "bridge the gap between classroom instruction and the world of work." Students gain both knowledge
